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MAKE A CHECKLIST

- Nothing will make you feel more in control than a checklist of what you have to do.
- Put things in order of importance, use a colour coding system or put your tasks in date order – whatever feels right to you!
- This system is great because it means you'll never accidentally forget to do something.
- It's also important to know how much you have to get done in the time you're given (it's never enough!)
- And ticking things off feels great!

USING YOUR CHECKLIST

- Make a timetable - Give yourself an idea of how long you have to focus on each thing (e.g. revision task or essay) and try to stick to it.
- This way you'll be able to avoid the dreaded last minute panic!
