
Year 11 Geography Revision

What are "Command Words"?

Command words appear at the start of questions and tell you what to do.

Understanding what these words mean is VITAL in achieving a good grade in Geography

Explain

- · Why is this?
- Use evidence and use linkages like "this is because".
- · If you haven't said why then you haven't answered the question

Describe


- · What is it like?
- If you are using a resource, write what you see. Make sure you select data from it.
- You don't need to explain in your answer (DO NOT write why it is like this)
- Example: Describe the distribution of

- This command requires detailed explanation of positive and negative points.
- Evaluate questions will be worth quite a lot of marks
- A good way to structure your answers
 - Brief intro define any key geographical words


