
GCSE English

English will enable you to demonstrate the speaking and listening, reading and writing skills that are required to participate in society and the world of work effectively and with confidence. You will be able to develop your ability to access and retrieve information from a broad range of written material by understanding and evaluating the purpose of the text. You will have the opportunity to develop your verbal reasoning, selecting speech appropriate to the situation and your audience, and become a critical reader, experiencing literary texts from different times, cultures and viewpoints.



There are two GCSEs in English: literature and language.
All students will complete the English Language specification at the end of Year 11. Most students will also complete the Literature GCSE, some at the end of Year 10, others at the end of Year 11.

Your work will build on that of KS3 with speaking and listening, reading and writing linked in order to show how language works.

Examining Board: WJEC Accreditation: GCSE Grades A* - G

The main areas that you will look at are:

Reading: discussion of and writing about all types of written material from novels and autobiographies to advertisements and articles,

Speaking and Listening: using talk to explore ideas, to argue a case and to give a presentation, **Writing:** in a variety of forms e.g. stories, articles, letters.

Assessment:

English Language - assessment is based upon speaking and listening assessments and final written examinations,

English Literature - two controlled assessment tasks, based on poetry and Shakespeare, that make up 25% of qualification,

- two 120 minute written examinations which test your responses to two novels, a play, and two unseen poems that make up 75% of qualification.


Who is suitable for this course?
