GCSE Skills

Everyone will be taking GCSE Skills (formerly known as Welsh Baccalaureate) in Year 10 and Year 11. The course adds a new dimension to your other subjects and courses. It encourages you to be more independent and adds 'real life' experiences to school and your studies.

The central focus of GCSE Skills is to provide an opportunity for developing essential and employability skills. The qualification will help you to prepare for your future by developing qualities and skills valued by post-16 educators and potential employers such as:

Literacy • Numeracy • Digital Literacy • Critical Thinking and Problem Solving
Creativity and Innovation • Planning and Organisation • Personal Effectiveness



To get your full qualification you will work through a series of challenges which are delivered through either controlled assessments and/or coursework.

The GCSE Skills is a fully graded A* to Pass GCSE and consists of three components:

Individual Project • Enterprise and Employability Challenge • Global Citizenship Challenge

The challenges will provide you with the opportunity to develop your knowledge and understanding of society, the community in which you live as well as an awareness of global issues, events and perspectives. Whilst you complete your challenges, you will be developing your skills for future study and employment!

For each challenge and your Individual Project you will be given an assessed mark and then all the marks will be added up to give you your GCSE Skills grade.


Who is suitable for this course?
