Why Choose GCSE Geography?

Geography will give you the opportunity to find out about a range of places in the UK, Europe and elsewhere in the world by investigating ideas, developing your own opinions and reaching decisions using map skills, fieldwork research and ICT. You will explore the ways in which natural processes have produced different landscapes and how people interact with them, observing how people can act together to prevent the total destruction of these environments. You will discover how people are affected by the action and decision-making of others locally, nationally and globally and the importance of sustainability when making decisions about how places and environments should be managed.



The nature of the work varies according to the topic studied. The necessity of using the internet to access up to date information is key to all topics. Decision making activities form an important part of the course, achieved through interpreting graphs, maps and photographs. You will also have the opportunity to participate in debates and group work activities. A compulsory part of the course is the participation in fieldtrips. Throughout GCSE Geography, you will develop a wide range of skills that will enhance your ability to interpret information as well as making decisions.

Unit 3 - Fieldwork Enquiry: you will carry out two fieldwork enquiries.

(2 hours 30 minutes non-examination assessment involving a class time written report that makes up 20% of the qualification)
