Assessment:

Unit 1: Product Design Written Paper - 2 hour written examination that makes up 50% of qualification.

Unit 2: Product Design Task - you will complete a major design and make project for the remaining 50% of qualification.

Part A: you will need to carry out an analysis of the problem, write a design specification, generate a range of ideas, develop a solution and produce the details of the final solution. (10 guided hours) **Part B:** you will plan the making process, carry out the making and evaluate the project. (20 guided hours)

Who is suitable for this course?

This course is equally suited to boys as it is to girls. If you enjoy designing and making things then this is the course for you. You will be allowed opportunities to work individually and as a team and the products that you design and make should improve the environment in which you live.
