A Level Units

AS Unit 1 - Film and Oracy - Oral examination that makes up 15% of qualification.

Section A: group discussion of 20 minutes

Section B: 5 minutes per candidate

AS Unit 2 - Non-examination Assessment - 3 extended written pieces on a topic related to Wales that makes up 10% of qualification.

AS Unit 3 - The Use of Language, and Poetry - 2 hours written examination that makes up 15% of qualification.

A2 Unit 4 - Drama and Oracy - Oral examination that makes up 25% of qualification.

Section A and B: group discussion of 30 minutes

Section C: 5 minutes per candidate

A2 Unit 5 - The Welsh Language in Society and Translanguaging - 2 hours written examination that makes up 15% of qualification.

A2 Unit 6 - The Use of Language and the Short Story - 2 hours written examination that makes up 20% of qualification.


Entry Requirements
